Honors and AP

- **♦ THE GRADE REQUIREMENT IS BACK FOR ALL MATH COURSES**
- Placement into Honors/AP is based on S1 grade (average of MP1 and MP2) and then final average at the end of the year for all academic subjects
 - o 90 or higher in Academic
 - 80 or higher in Honors/AP
- AP Micro/AP Macro: must have grade requirement in both English and Math
- AP Seminar: must have grade requirement in both English and Social Studies

NEW Honors/AP Level Change Procedures

- Level changes will only be honored up to the mid-marking period progress report time (within 5 days of the grades being posted).
- The **Level Change Request Form** is required to initiate a level-change.
 - The form requires students to indicate what interventions have been attempted to improve academic performance in designated course (i.e. extra help, tutoring, meeting with teacher, etc)
 - Once approved by content level supervisor, the current grade will follow the student to the new course.
- ★ Level changes will not be permitted after this time

Option II PE

- Alternate PE:

 - BR Sports do not cover MP3-not an option
 - Minimum of 150 minutes per week in alternate activity
 - Outside sport:
 - Requires letter from outside coach
 - Minimum of 150 minutes per week in alternate activity
 - You are provided with a study hall; you may NOT take a class during this period.
- Online PE:
 - Online PE cannot be done over the summer
 - Students will register in **September** to start the course
- Online Health can be done over summer

 - Must have a 3.0 GPA
 - Must have a 540 CR on SAT/24 on ACT
 - Accuplacer can be taken at RVCC
 - Freshman level course and senior research process
 - o Television and Video Production 1, 2, 3 and 4 Rider College Credit
 - Honors Accounting II Fairleigh Dickinson credit

NJGPA: Junior Testing Requirement

- NJGPA will be in the Spring
- English and Math testing requirement
- 2 sections of English and 2 Math sections
 - o 90 minutes each
- ◆ Other test scores cannot be used unless you've taken the NJGPA (examples: SAT, PSAT, ACT, etc.)*

Important Scheduling Reminders

- ♦ Students cannot make changes to their scheduling requests after April 6, 2023
- When making your scheduling requests select:
 - Core academic courses
 - Flective courses
 - At least <u>3</u> alternate courses that you want in case you do not get your first choice elective(s)
- Your school counselor will meet with you individually to review your selections
 - Any changes can be made at that time
 - Any questions you may have can be addressed at that time
